The bride's mother and grandmother placed apples under the tree to symbolise fertility in the marriage. **the ceremony** The sun was just starting to set when Annalise and Clarence said their vows, casting a golden glow over the vineyard. **the cake** Springs with scrabble tiles popped out of the three-tiered lemon-coloured wedding cake.
